Good Clinical Practice

Good Clinical Practice (GCP) is the international ethical, scientific and practical standard to which all clinical research is conducted.

It is important that everyone involved in research is trained or appropriately experienced to perform the specific tasks they are being asked to undertake. GCP training is a requirement set out in the [UK Policy Framework for Health and Social Care Research](#) developed by the [Health Research Authority](#) for researchers conducting clinical trials of investigational medicinal products (CTIMPs).

GCP protects the rights, safety and wellbeing of study participants

We recommend that team members leading and delivering research complete, as a minimum, the Introduction to Good Clinical Practice (GCP) course (online or face-to-face). This should be followed by additional specialist courses where appropriate (e.g. Informed Consent) and regular GCP Refresher training.

Research team members who undertake limited duties working to well defined instructions and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) may find locally delivered NIHR short courses and training aids more appropriate. This should be discussed with the Chief Investigator of the study.

In 2023 we plan to conduct

1. **On-line Research Forums** – these forums will be designed for aspiring and current clinical academics in University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Trust. We will invite presentations from Masters, Doctoral and Post-Doctoral students/researchers who will present for 5 minutes on their current project. This will be followed by a Q&A session and opportunity for networking. We want to design this collaboratively with you to ensure the content; venue and frequency of the forums meet your needs – To be discussed at the first Forum – date to be arranged.
2. **Research placements** for M level and BSc level students within the Clinical Academic Careers Team – we are delighted to be moving forwards with setting up our first research placement in collaboration with the Speech and Language Therapy team at Birmingham City University, the Physiotherapy team at Coventry University and Nursing teams at University of Birmingham. Our placement will be launched on May 15th 2023 and will run through until June 30th 2023 in the ICA office with a research and development three week ‘sandwich’ in the middle 22nd May – 9th June.
