

General Practice Improvement Leads programme


The General Practice Improvement Leads programme is an accredited personal development programme for those working in NHS general practice. Participants gain new perspectives, skills, and confidence in using quality improvement tools and techniques (improvement science) for service redesign and leading colleagues and teams through change.

What does it look like?

The programme is held over six full days (virtual or in-person), with support sessions (webinars) and an optional coaching call.

Programme content

The programme is highly participative, incorporating action learning through activities, discussions, and personal project work, with participants leading a **small-scale piece of improvement work**.



Participants must identify a specific problem/issue to work on during the programme that their practice/network is ready and able to address within the timeframe of the programme. It should be involve a change that could result in an improvement, altering how work/activity is done; producing measurable, positive differences in results relative to the baseline and have a lasting impact. Examples might include improving a recall system, optimising the care navigation or triage process, improving the process for handling documents, increasing the uptake of online consultations.

This is a practical programme and participants will be expected to participate fully, including contributing actively to discussions and group work. Participants will provide updates on their progress throughout, using an electronic workbook and present a final summary of progress to date and learning on the final day.

Cohorts held IN PERSON

- For cohorts held in person (i.e. face-to-face), overnight accommodation (bed and breakfast only) is available if required, for the middle night of each module at no cost to delegates. Accommodation must be requested at the application stage and is booked centrally for delegates by the Primary Care Transformation Team.
- Travel costs are not funded. Delegates will need to arrange and cover the cost of their own travel as needed, including between workshop venue and overnight accommodation if these are not in the same location.

Cohorts held VIRTUALLY

All sessions will be held on the MS Teams platform. Delegates should ensure they have sole use of a computer with working camera and sound.

Individuals must apply for their own place and must commit to attend all days for the cohort. There are up to 30 places available on each cohort held in person and 16 places for cohorts held virtually. Places are offered on a first come, first served basis for those who fulfil the application requirements set out above.
